# ILLEGAL SUPSTANCES R CONTRULED DRUGS

#### **Possessing or Supplying:**

- Pupils are not permitted to bring controlled drugs into school or to misuse such substances while on the school premises. This policy also applies to all out of school visits.
- If illegal substance misuse by a pupil is confirmed the Principal, in consultation with the Board of Governors, will apply sanctions in accordance with our Discipline Policy as well as offering appropriate pastoral support.

# Statistics inform us that the number of young people who use and misuse substances is rising. Parents should therefore be aware of the dangers of substance abuse. On the back of this leaflet are useful resources and agencies which offer advice and support for both parents and young people.

# ALCIP

- Pupils are not permitted to bring alcohol into school or to consume it on school premises.
- This policy also applies to all out of school visits.



- Pupils are not permitted to bring cigarettes or tobacco into school or smoke while on school premises.
- Pupils are not permitted to smoke on school visits or in any public place while in school uniform.



Pupils who breach these codes of behaviour will be subject to the appropriate sanctions and their parent/s will be informed.

# **Drugs Education within the Curriculum**

Information on drugs is delivered by various departments across year groups as part of our Personal Development programme.
