

SDP 25/28 - We are Strathearn

Our <u>goal</u> for the next three years is to renew our vision for the pupils and staff in a learning community where <u>encouragement</u>, <u>empowerment</u> and the opportunity to <u>excel</u> are prioritised in all that we do. We wish to embrace a <u>research informed approach</u> to our decision making, upskilling our staff and maintaining a high standard of learner outcomes.



To achieve this goal, we have 4 new KEY PRIORITIES for improvement along with our ongoing action areas:

KP1 - To reform our *curriculum and timetable provision* for maximum learner benefit, informed by pedagogical research and resource sustainability

KP2 - To enhance the knowledge and skills progression of our pupils, supported by research informed teachers

KP3 - To promote and support the *health, wellbeing and resilience* of pupils

KP4 - To ensure pupils with *special, additional or other educational needs* progress in line with their peers through enhanced monitoring and support

These key priorities for improvement will be targeted through actions over the next three years centred on the 10 focus areas below:
